At the end of every six weeks, we showcase progress in a **product demo**, which highlights the most recent work from the three sprints within that increment.

Next, we'll plan **increments** by organizing the recipe into smaller groups of tasks—our **sprints**.

For example, completing a crust involves sprints to mix dough ingredients, roll the dough, and shape the crust.

Subsequent sprints tackle other pie elements, such as peeling apples or perfecting the filling.

These iterative development cycles include refining the recipe with feedback, perhaps adjusting the topping's flavor or texture based on taste tests.

By the end, we deliver a custom pie that meets your needs—just as Agile ensures a product that fulfills your project requirements.
